Cluster Full STEAM Ahead Update

Yesterday Trawalla School welcomed visitors from across the Pyrenees Cluster for a Full STEAM Ahead day. The schools included Amphitheatre, Landsborough, Moonambel, Natte Yallock and Navarre. We started with a cool morning that ended up a very warm and sunny day.

We commenced with the assembly, Trawalla student, May did the 'Welcome to Country' acknowledgment. Mr Tromp, from Moonambel, played the guitar for the singing of the National Anthem and this was followed by Happy Birthday to students and staff who have recently celebrated a birthday.

After assembly was Resilience, Rights & Respectful Relationships (RRRR). The lessons today focused on problem solving. Students explored strategies to develop options to find a solution when faced with a problem.

The subjects offered today also included PE, science and music.

In PE all students did practice for the upcoming athletics carnival. They did shot put, discus, relay running and long jump.

In science, the students were exploring our environment. They were able to search the school yard for bugs and insects. Each find was identified and students were able to learn about the mini beasts that live in our school yards.
